FCPF Inception workshop, March 14, 2014

1. Background

About Cambodia and REDD+

Cambodia has been classified as a country with "high forest cover", and "high deforestation rate". According to FAO forest resource assessment (2010), Cambodia has approximately 10.1 million ha of forest, constituting 57% of the total land area. During recent decades, however, Cambodia has experienced high rates of deforestation, for instance, 1.2 % per year between 2005 and 2010 (FAO 2010).

The Royal Government of Cambodia (RGC) recognized REDD+ as a crucial strategy to tackle the alarming rates of deforestation and forest degradation in the country. Thus far, the Cambodia REDD+ national programme has been supported by numerous supporting frameworks including the UN-REDD programme (comprised of FAO, UNDP and UNEP).

About the World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) and the proposed FCPF REDD+ readiness project in Cambodia

World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) is a global partnership of governments, businesses, civil society, and Indigenous Peoples focused on REDD+ with 44 participant countries including Cambodia. In July, 2013, FCPF approved a revised Readiness Preparation Proposal (R-PP) submitted by the Cambodian government. UNDP has been selected as a delivery partner for the project. On August 26th, 2013, the local project appraisal committee meeting was held at UNDP Cambodia and the meeting endorsed the project to be launched. On December 17th and 25h, 2013, the project document was signed by UNDP, Cambodia and Forestry Administration.

The proposed project duration is over a period of three and a half years from January, 2014 to June, 2017. It has been proposed that along with UNDP as a delivery partner, the project will be jointly implemented by Forestry Administration (FA) of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fishery (MAFF) as an implementing partner and by General Department of Administration for Nature Conservation and Protection (GDANCP) of the Ministry of Environment (MoE) and Fishery Administration (FiA) of MAFF as responsible parties.

The project builds on existing supporting frameworks for REDD+ and aims to further assist the Cambodian government to be ready for REDD+ through its financial and technical support to attain the following four outcomes:

- 1. Establishment of effective National Management of the REDD+ Readiness process and stakeholder engagement in accordance with the consultation principles
- 2. Development of the National REDD+ Strategy and Implementation Framework

- 3. Improved capacity to manage REDD+ at subnational levels
- 4. Designing monitoring system for REDD+ with capacity for implementation.

In order to ensure the effective project implementation and successful attainments of the proposed activities and outcomes, there remains a further need to specify, refine, and coordinate project objectives, activities and work plans before and during the project inception phase.

2. Objective

To main objectives of the FCPF inception workshop are to:

- Discuss the scope, the main objectives and the expected results of the FCPF project;
- Develop broad ownership of the project through validation of results framework;
- Receive inputs from relevant stakeholders during the workshop to develop a draft inception report of the FCPF project. The inception repot may include:
 - Project structure and management arrangement and its alignment with national policy priorities
 - Annual Work Plan (AWP)
 - Revised log frame with more up-to-date baseline and measurable and achievable indicators
 - o TORs of the staff and secretariat
- Prepare for an approval of the AWP by the PEB at the 7th meeting of the Project Executive Board on 3 April, 2014.

A draft agenda is provided in the Annex.

3. Expectation

Enhanced awareness and "ownership" of the FCPF project among key stakeholder groups in Cambodia.

4. Key outputs

The key outputs of the launching workshop are:

- 1) Stakeholders, especially relevant government agencies, local authorities, NGOs and local communities are informed about FCPF projects and its intended results, implementation arrangement and work plan for 2014 and 2015.
- 2) Comments and inputs received from stakeholders on the approach of the project implementation and on benchmarks of work plan.
- 3) A final inception report incorporating stakeholders inputs.
