<i>“Introduction to IPCC 2006, 2003, and 1996 guideline and differences between the guideline”, by Matieu Henry</i>	<p>[Matieu Henry]: briefly talked about IPCC 1996, GPG 2003 and IPCC 2006 and the differences of the 3 software.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ IPCC 1996 GHGs emission sources from land use change and forest (LUCF) and the need of information/data from 6 sources including energy, industry, pollutants, land use changes and forest agriculture and wastes. ▪ GPG 2003, sources of GHGs from land use, land use changes and forest (LULUCF) and the need of information from 5 sources including forest land, grassland, agriculture crop land, houses/settlement, wetland and others. ▪ IPCC 2006 sources of GHGs emission from agricultural land, forest ,and other land uses (AFOLU), and the required information including general guidelines and energy, industry, and the uses of agricultural product, forest and other land uses plus wastes.

<p><i>“Methodology for Carbon Stock Emission”, by Ono Shigeru</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Ono provided a brief presentation on “Methodology for Carbon Stock Emission” this was a slight change from the original agenda item “Identification of current information & data available (introduction to test calculation).” ▪ The following points were mentioned: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Method of Carbon calculation: tier1, tier 2, tier 3. It requires a clear decision to be made. ○ Cambodia should use the revised 1996 while 2003 is also encouraged to use if Cambodia prefers. The word “Encourage” here sounds stronger than just “Suggest”, but more likely “Would like to”. ○ Method#1: working papers preparation following the UNFCCC guideline. ○ Method#2: stock change. Trial calculation which method is a little bit easy for work. It may be application for Cambodia’s context. For example, Draft working paper #9 (attached).
<p><i>“Possibility of no cost extension UN-REDD programme”, by Mathieu Van Rijn</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Mathieu, vR gave a presentation on proposal for no-cost extension to the UN-REDD programme to complete activities related to MRV (outcome 4). He would like to discuss possible scenarios with the MRV TT members first. Once it is clear and the proposal could be reported to the National Programme Director for UN-REDD. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Scenario #1 (6 months extension): the proposal of no-cost extension to be requested until mid-June 2015. (see document enclosed) ○ Scenario #2 (12 months extension): the proposal for no-cost extension to be requested until end of December 2015. (see document enclosed) ▪ A draft statement presented (attached) which points out the reasons why we requires an extension, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The current status of progress of the MRV activities since the MRV/REL technical team became only operational since January 2014. ○ Several constraints and necessary time to build capacities. <p>Mathieu would like all the participants to discuss and share their ideas/ recommendation for the implementation of the programme and suggestion regarding the statement of the MRV TT.</p>
<p><i>Discussion on “MRV video script for awareness raising”</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ [Saret]: According to the suggestion from the meeting with H.E Chea Sam Ang, I would like to now discuss video scripts produced by REDD+ Taskforce. ▪ [Mathieu]: I have checked with communication, but unfortunately I have not a clear answer on the objective of message to be communicated. ▪ [Sophat]: from the current scripts itself, the audience seems to be for scholars and high educators. ▪ [Saret]: Audiences are to be clarified now. Yes, it seems to be too technical for the current messages. It seems suit to NGOs, practitioners or managers

	<p>on similar fields. I think, it should be just simple. There should be two separated episodes 1) - for community and it needs to be simple; 2) - for practitioner and it needs to be technical.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ [Kimsrim]: the content should be clear plus the activities for MRV specifically. ▪ [Nok Ven]: for community people, it should be simple and easy to understand. Their roles simply in the protection activities. ▪ [Matieu]: it need to be quite carefully these messages #10, #13, #15, for example (handout provided during the MRV meeting) ▪ [Mathieu]: MRV is technical and there seem to be a lot of misconception in the messages that MRV TT would like to communicate. ▪ [Chivin]: it seems to be quite difficult and REDD+ secretariat have not communicated with MRV TT about this. It needs to clearly identify who is the target audience. ▪ [Matieu]: It should be proposed for round table discussion suggesting ideas on awareness raising (video script). ▪ [Sophat]: This drafted script is likely for only MRV TT not for the community due to its technicality. <p>[Mathieu]: I agreed that there should be two parts (i) MRV (for this drafted script) and (ii) another scripts for community/targeted audiences.</p>
<p><i>“Follow-up on National Forest Inventory”, by Khorn Saret</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ [Mathieu]: the final draft document will be reviewed by different universities and the network of Matieu, H’s. This is a peer review and the comments will be answered or reflected in the NFI design. ▪ [Saret]: I would like to take this opportunity to announce a new member of MRV nominated by Mol. He is Mr. Sreng Sopheap, Deputy Director of Local Administration Department.
<p><i>Recap and Next step</i></p>	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The differences between IPCC 2006, GPC 2003 & IPCC 1996. Thus, the MRV teams have requested for a training on the method of data interpretation through IPCC guidelines GPG 2003, IPCC 1996 to all MRV Technical Team. ▪ The possibility of No-Cost Extension request of the UNREDD. MRV TT proposed that REDD+ Taskforce Secretariat (RTS) team present the remaining budget and explain the plan of budget spending for MRV/REL work activities implementation at first hand then MRV/REL will make a proposal to the team leaders for decision making. ▪ TV scripts for awareness raising on MRV/REL work. The MRV/REL TT agreed that it requires clear explanation from the script writer “to which target audience for awareness raising for the current script (level)?” If the audiences are local communities then it requires scripts revision to be more simple and easier to understand. ▪ Updates of the technical guideline on National Forestry Inventory. For the time being the report is still under discussion and providing feedback and the working team will send this drafted report to all the

	stakeholders especially related forest expertise academic institutions for comments and feedback.
